PROCLAMATION

OF A TOWN STATE OF EMERGENCY

TOWN OF MARSHALL, NORTH CAROLINA

- **Section 1** Pursuant to Chapter 166A of the North Carolina General Statutes and Article 36A, Chapter 14 of the North Carolina General Statutes, I have determined that a State of Emergency exists in the Town of Marshall because of damage or incidents occurring from strong winds and flooding.
- **Section 2** I, therefore, proclaim the existence of a State of Emergency in the Town of Marshall.
- Section 3 I hereby order all Town Law Enforcement Officers, Town Employees subject to my control to cooperate in the enforcement and implementation of provision of the County Emergency Ordinance which are set forth below.
- **Section 4** Town personnel are authorized to cooperate with Madison County Emergency personnel to establish emergency shelters.
- **Section 5** Evacuation. I have determined that, in the best interest of public safety and protection, it may be necessary to evacuate the civilian population from areas with power outages or safety risks involving strong winds and flooding. Citizens are free to use any type of transportation, but they are to follow direction of law enforcement officers in leaving the area. Evacuation may occur at any time during this proclamation. Further proclamation concerning evacuation will be issued as needed.
- **Section 6** Town employees shall work cooperatively with Madison County Emergency Personnel to assure the needs of Town of Marshall citizens are met to the extent possible with those resources under my control.
- **Section 7** All Civilians, Emergency Management Personnel and other Town Employees are ordered to comply with Madison County's Emergency Operation Plan.
- **Section 8** This proclamation shall become effective immediately.
