

System Pressure Advisory!

The water consumers of the Town of Marshall located from Intersection Walnut Creek Drive and North Main to 1025 North Main in Madison County are experiencing periods of low pressure and outages in the distribution system due to maintenance and/ or repair of the water line system. Periods of low or no pressure in the distribution system increase the potential for back siphonage and introduction of bacteria into the water system.

Therefore, when the water service is restored, consumers are advised to **boil all water** used for human consumption (including drinking, making ice, brushing teeth, washing dishes and food preparation) or use bottled water.

Vigorous boiling for one (1) minute should kill any disease-causing organisms that may be present in the water.

Water customers are strongly urged to conserve water whenever possible. This advisory will remain in effect until further written notification is issued.

Boiling water concentrates any levels of nitrates that may be present in the water. Infants below the age of six months and pregnant women should use an alternate water supply (e.g., bottled water) whenever possible.
